


Local Policing for Local People Roadshow is coming to Stevning

Steyning Community Orchard: August 2024

STEYNING COMMUNITY ORCHARD

We are delighted to have received two grants recently to help plant more fruit trees around Steyning.

The first grant application was to the Thatcher's Community Orchard Project. They provide 500 free apple trees each year to charities/ community groups around the country. We were delighted to get this reply; 'We have been blown away by the quality of the

entries, and the passion that everyone has for planting trees. We very much liked your entry and would love to send you 10 apple trees for your projects. Regards Thatchers.'

One of our Community Orchard Steering Group, Simon Knowles, has good links with Steyning Primary School where he used to work. He put the idea of creating a small orchard at the school to Simon Phipps, the new Head Teacher, who was very happy to support the idea. So, we will be planting these 10 trees, with help from the school children, in the school grounds this October.

The second grant was from the Rampion Community Benefit Fund at Sussex Community Foundation.

We requested £1,000 to buy the first 22 trees we will be planting at the new Bramber Castle Orchard. We were delighted to hear that our grant application had been successful, and we have already placed our order for the trees with our fruit tree nursery.

This new Orchard will be planted on a field to the west of the Castle. This is part of the National Trust's (NT) estate, but the

field itself lies just outside the Scheduled Monument of Bramber Castle. Nevertheless, the NT carried out an archaeological survey on the field, using ground penetrating radar, just to make sure that we won't disturb anything by planting trees here. Fortunately for us (but possibly

not for the archaeologists) nothing significant was found.

They believe this flat field may have been formed from the spoil removed whilst digging the ditches that form the moat around the castle. There is also an aerial photo of this field taken in the 1950's showing parallel lines of what look like vegetables or arable crops growing there. So there has probably been cultivation here for many years that could have further destroyed any archaeology that might have been there.

Therefore the NT and English Heritage (who manage the site for the NT) are now pushing ahead with preparatory work on the site, including clearing some trees affected by Ash dieback disease, and installing new fencing and stiles, ready for us to plant the trees next February/March. This will be the largest planting of trees we have ever done in one day, so we may ask for extra help!


The Life Impossible by **Matt Haig**





Far, far away in the south-east corner of Europe, the

Balkan Mountains tower over the landscape. Their valleys were once home to the fearsome Thracian tribes, who made empires tremble when they rode screaming into battle on their wild horses. But even more ancient battles were being fought deep in these majestic mountains.

Here in the Balkans, there grew a strange and mighty tree. Its huge seeds were encased in spiky armour and its leaves were like giant hands which cast shade all around. But this tree had been cursed. Each year a plague of tiny moths would attack the tree, their caterpillars would burrow inside every leaf. Green leaves turned to brown, leaving the tree apparently lifeless and defeated.

Yet each year the tree would return with renewed green vigour, and each year the moths would attack with the same resolve. And so, for centuries the tree and the moth remained trapped in the Balkan Mountains, locked in their epic, age-old battle.

Then one day men came from the west, discovered this magnificent tree, gathered its

seeds and planted them in their world. And so it was that the branches and the empire of the Horse Chestnut spread across Europe's parks and gardens. People admired it and reclined in the shade of its broad palmate leaves. Schoolboys used its seeds to fight their own playground battles.

The conker tree had conquered the continent. Here in this new world the curse of the moth had been lifted and the Horse Chestnut flourished. Meanwhile, the tree's nemesis, not a particularly strong flyer, remained imprisoned in the remote valleys of the Balkan Mountains for centuries, more myth than moth.

Then, one day, the modern world arrived. Construction workers building roads through the mountains were unwittingly building the perfect means for the moth to escape and spread. Now all it needed was a lift. So, the moth stuck out its six thumbs and hitched a ride.

The Horse Chestnut Leaf Miner moth was first discovered, identified and named in Greece in 1984. Twenty years later, in 2004, an innocent motorist pulled off the A27 in to the University of Sussex car park, unaware they had brought a sinister stowaway into Sussex. Since then, every Horse Chestnut in Sussex has been moth-eaten. Look to the leaves and you'll see the great Balkan battle raging right on your doorstep.





August Gardening Journal

August is a great time to enjoy the long Summer evenings in your garden, it's a time of rich colour, flavour and texture. The late summer perennials and statuesque ornamental grasses will be coming into their own and the vegetable gardens will be bursting with produce, ready to fill our kitchens with fresh vegetables straight to the plate. It's a quieter time in the gardening year so put the tools down and make the most of the hard work completed earlier in the year. Hopefully, the Sun might appear too!

Sanguisorba are a group of hardy herbaceous Burnets are found throughout Europe, perennials belonging to the Rosaceae family. They have pinnate foliage with toothed leaflet margins and branched wiry stems with and different hybrids flower throughout the terminal clusters of burrs, nodding catkins or candle-like flowers in white, green, pink. red and plum. Commonly known as burnets, there are around 18 species and thousands of sanguisorba cultivars have good autumn hybrids.

There are a couple of Sanguisorba native to the UK: a diminutive pinnate-leaved plant that has small, globular, greenish-red heads with long straggly stamens: the salad burnet (Sanguisorba minor) and the other, the great burnet (Sanguisorba officinalis).

Officinalis prefers moisture-retentive soils in meadows or at the edge of woodland. It is much taller at 1.2m with small, burgundy bobbles atop wiry stems.

Asia, Japan and North America. They are particularly suited to naturalistic plantings, season from late April to November, although many of the popular garden cultivars are at their best from June to September. Many foliage tints too.

As all species and hybrids readily hybridise, these features get thoroughly mixed up in the resulting progeny.

Growing several different burnets in close proximity has produced some wonderful hybrids such as those at Sussex Prairies where substantial specimens of Sanguisorba 'Blackthorn', with upright tapers of smoky pink flowers, are likely parents to the Sussex Prairies hybrids: 'Sussex Prairies Cheyenne',

'Sussex Prairies Navaho', 'Sussex Prairies Iroquois' and 'Sussex Prairies Apache'.

The foliage of sanguisorba dies back in autumn and regrows again in spring, but the spent flowers can still look attractive if left on the plant over winter. Cut them back in late winter or early spring before the new stems appear. Divide sanguisorba in spring, when the plant is growing away quickly.

Garden varieties of Sanguisorba grow best in moist but well drained soil, ideally in full sun. In dry weather plants look great; in wet conditions they can look a little bedraggled. In a mixed border Sainguisorba pair well with tall grasses, spiky Veronicastrum, thistles like Echinops and dasies like Echinacea and Leucanthemum.

The airy, wiry stems of Sanguisorba provide spots of colour that appear to hover around the other planting enhancing the overall look and feel of a scheme. It's a great plant for adding, height, form and texture to a scheme without becoming too dominant. Definitely one of my favorites of you are looking to achieve that natural look.

Jobs to be Done August: **Ornamental Garden:**

- Continue to deadhead, especially dahlias which should be looking great by now.
- Weed!!! there shouldn't be too much of this but it's best to keep on top of it.
- Keep the lawn mown and edges cut due to dry weather you may need to raise the height of the cut if you want to keep your

- lawn green.
- Trim hedges now the birds have finished nesting now's the time to get your hedges back in order.
- Water Any plants that are looking a bit tired and are wilting, are in need of a drink. If they look really bad, then water immediately and then top up later in the day when it's cooler.
- If you have any meadow areas, then these should be cut, and the hay raked asap.
- · Spray and feed roses.
- · Plant out autumn flowering bulbs eg colchicum.
- Remove lavender stalks and trim bush leaving some green fresh foliage.
- Order Spring flowering bulbs.
- Ensure camellias have sufficient water to ensure flowers for next year.
- · Clip evergreen shrubs.
- · Prune current seasons growth of wisteria back to 5-6 leaves

Vegetable Garden:

- · Harvest Garlic.
- · Sow oriental greens such as mizuna and mibuna, pak choi etc.
- Harvest early apples.
- · Start lifting main crop potatoes.
- · Summer prune trained fruit such as espalier apples, pears etc.
- · Trim non-flowering stems of grapes cutting back to one leaf from the main branch.

The Lord of the Medieval Manor

Old documents can paint a surprisingly intimate picture of life in the past. We know, for instance, that Alice Carle, widow of Philip Carle, had to 'make and get ready litter for the lord's bed and shall have a loaf, a gallon of ale and a dish of cooked food for her pains.'

This little gem comes from a fourteenth century custumal, a custumal being a document which sets out the tasks to be performed, by custom, by each of the tenants of a manor.

Sadly, no custumal survives for Stevning itself but they do for a couple of our neighbouring manors. This example comes from Streatham, just the other side of the river, but we have also drawn on a Wiston custumal as well.

Having his bed prepared for him was not the only perk enjoyed by the lord of the manor. Everything was considered, so John Loteby had to 'clean out the buildings of the Manor once a year against the lord's coming, and shall gather reeds or rushes against his coming. He shall plant potherbs for two half days before or after dinner, and shall gather apples for two half days, before or after dinner. He shall carry the letters of the steward of the lands for summoning the Court.'

Moreover, Walter, son of Henry Pokerle, when the lord came in the summer, had to 'cart two wainloads of sticks to make bowers.' - though it's a bit difficult to visualise to have had 'a horse or mare on the lord's what is meant by this. There was also

William Marchal, the smith. Amongst various responsibilities for keeping the manor's ploughs in good order, he had to 'shoe the steward's horse on four feet every time he holds Court, and shall have 1d. for the four shoes'.

The steward was responsible to the lord of the manor for all the manors in a particular lordship. Steyning was just one of the manors belonging to the Abbey of Fecamp and the Abbev's steward would have divided his time between all of them.

When he attended the court sittings held in the manor of Steyning Walter Bennett, the steward for Fecamp in 1338, was himself referred to as 'the lord' in an old account roll: he was allocated one bushel of oats for his horse and, on various occasions, two piglets, a lamb, and three geese as court expenses plus 'four sheep for the Lord's hunting dogs.'

Those further down the manorial hierarchy also did reasonably well. The 'Reeve', in Stevning's case William de Saon, looked after the day to day running of the manor. Over in Streatham, that would have allowed him pasture in summer, and in winter at hay

without provender,' and 'his food as often, and as long as, the Lord is in the manor, and also when the steward comes to hold Court. In harvest, that is from Lammas (August 1st) to Michaelmas (September 29th), he shall have a quarter of barley, if the lord is not staying in the manor, and if he is he shall be at the lord's table, if the lord wills.'

There was a 'Rider' too, whose job was to 'oversee that the reapers reap the lord's corn well and fairly'. He would 'have his food at three meals, and his horse likewise, and he shall have an aver [a carthorse] in the lord's pasture in summer. He shall also have his dinner as long as the lord stays in the manor.'

It may be one of those coincidences that the 'rider' at Streatham in 1374 was Robert Wolgar and the man in the same roll in Steyning in 1338 was John Wolgar.

But the full extent of the lord's control over his tenants is set out in his contract with one, William Holdene. 'If he dies' it says 'the

lord shall have as a heriot his best beast, or 6d. if he have none. He shall not give his daughters in marriage, nor sell colts or steers bred by him, nor part with them in any way, nor put his son into Orders, without the lord's leave.' And yet this clause was written into the custumal at a time when the ties of lordship were beginning to loosen.
