The Repair Café which happens at Bramber and Beeding Village Hall on the 2nd Saturday of the month has been remarkably successful in obvious and unexpected ways. You have brought in over 1300 items for us to repair and we have managed to repair over 900 of them. We've also sharpened over 1300 items such as secateurs, shears, loppers, scissors and knives. Keep them coming!

Young people of the District invited to shape future leisure and outdoor spaces



Horsham District Council is inviting people to share their thoughts about outdoor space and leisure provision for teenagers in a new survey launching today. There will also be a series of focus groups with local schools and youth forums. The survey was created by a special task group of councillors, set up to understand whether outdoor spaces in the District meet the needs of teenage girls and boys equally. The results will help the Council to review current policies to try and ensure shortfalls identified are addressed in future design and planning.

Commenting on the initiative. Horsham District Council Overview and Scrutiny Chairman Paul Clarke said:

'Creating leisure spaces that work for everyone and ensuring that all voices are heard is key for us as a council. This survey forms an important

part of our 'Fair Space for all' initiative.

It is focussed on developing leisure spaces which feel safe and accessible for everybody, including teenage girls. Our aim is to encourage active healthy lifestyles through all stages of life. The task group is being led by Councillor Samantha Bateman.'



'The focus groups will run in participating schools, colleges and youth forums across the District. Whilst the survey hopes to capture the thoughts of teenage girls and

their parents, everyone's feedback to the survey is welcome. We are a council which wants to deliver Fair Space for all.

Our feeling is that our general understanding on outdoor sports and leisure facilities is strong, but we want to develop our understanding of different groups' needs. If proven necessary, this work and survey will

help identify improvements to provision for teenage girls.'

The Council committed in its 2024/25 Annual Plan to better understand the needs of the community to deliver services that support people in leading a healthy and active lifestyle, and as part of this, to create safe spaces for our children and young people to grow.

The survey is running until Friday 1st November, 2024.

October: Steyning Community Orchard

The Community Orchard is run by a small group of volunteers who share various roles. But the role of treasurer is one where we rely on an individual who has the necessary skills.

We are lucky to have such a person in Richard He described his role here 'I have been the treasurer of Steyning Community Orchard since February 2017. I discovered, after retiring from my day job as an accountant and finding more time to spend in Steyning that I quickly became more popular than I had ever been in that day job. Of course this was not only due to my accounting skills, attractive personality and general bonhomie but also to an urgent need for community organisations like Steyning Community Orchard to find anyone vaguely numerate to take on the not-very-soughtafter role of treasurer.

My predecessor was relocating to a different part of the country (from Stevning!?) but fortunately not because of the overburdensome demands of the treasurer's job. I already knew Alec Harden who was leader of the SCO at the time and so I guess there was an inevitability that I would be approached, given the absence of a queue forming at Alec's door. To his great credit Alec gave a very fair and accurate description of the work involved and put me under no pressure at all, explaining that the role was undemanding and required no great commitment. He knew me better than I thought, understanding that this reversal of the usual psychological pressure would be the best approach to take. It was inevitable that I would accept.

However, 7 years on, I can genuinely say that the role has been exactly as Alec described and it has been a privilege to make a very small contribution to a wonderful community project, one of many in Steyning, designed to protect and enhance the beautiful environment in which we live.

And, of course, the truth is that the

accounting input is blissfully minimal. The constitution of SCO is written on one page of A4 paper and is easy to understand. There are no lengthy sections on the necessary procedures for calling meetings, raising funds, resolving disagreements or on gender equality and racial bias, which is based on an underlying assumption that people will behave reasonably. So far, there has been no reason to revisit this assumption!





LOCAL BUSINESS FOCUS

Under Pressure or Over Pressure?!?



My Blood Pressure (BP) certainly experienced some alarming fluctuations earlier this summer, when I was returning home at dusk after playing the opening cricket match of the season. As I approached my driveway, I was astonished to see two ponies standing unattended in the road. If I hadn't been driving, I would have attributed this apparition to a couple of pints of strong cider, but given my sobriety, there was no denying that these equines were quite literally present 'in the flesh'.

My immediate concern was obviously the possibility of an accident on the road – and this was shared by another driver who pulled over coming from the opposite direction. The ponies were understandably a little skittish, with no headcollars or evidence of their origin - I suspect that their blood pressure - as well as mine - was probably well above normal, fuelled by some fight or flight adrenaline. Together, we managed to herd them off the road and into my driveway, after which I went across to a neighbour who had some stables to see if they were down a couple of occupants. Unfortunately they were unable to help and on return, there was no sign of the ponies or their temporary warden. Assuming that maybe their rightful owner had turned up, I headed to my house only to find that the ponies had progressed from driveway into my garden where they had found more bountiful fare in the form of our flower bed - cue another spike in BP! I suspect that my erstwhile helper had understandably seen the opportunity to relinquish his responsibility in favour of the home-owner and taken a quick exit!

Lacking any pony paraphernalia, I then spent the next 10 minutes trying to catch the ponies with DIY headcollars made from dog leads. The first was quite easy to catch with an outstretched hand containing a dandelion leaf. The second was more

wily and made a bolt back towards the road causing an alarming spike in my BP which certainly took it well above 120/80. Luckily my own fight



or flight kicked in and I was able loop my dog lead around its neck and with the reassurance of something around its neck the pony was happy to be restrained. We were able to find a stable for the night (nativity style!) and the ponies were repatriated from where they had escaped the next day - crisis averted!

While my BP fluctuations were situational, persistently high blood pressure (hypertension) can cause insidious disease in pets as well as their human counterparts. Hypertension is more common in cats than dogs, with a recent study estimating 23% of cats over the age of 9 to be affected. Hypertension is often secondary to other conditions such as kidney disease, heart or thyroid disease, but can also be primary. The concern is that it is often not apparent until the condition has significantly progressed – often with serious consequences such as blindness caused by bleeding behind the eye, neurological signs if the brain is affected, or fainting, collapse and breathing issues if the heart is affected

The good news is that there are lots of treatment options for hypertension and the best way to tackle it is to treat before any of the serious signs above occur. This means checking blood pressure in older / high risk cats routinely – as is the case in many doctors surgeries. This October we're focusing on hypertension in cats and offering blood pressure checks with our nurses on any cat over 9 years for only £20. 
October 2024 Book Reviews



Raising Hare by Chloe Dalton
Canongate £18.99
When Chloe Dalton finds a leveret (young hare) in a field near her house, she doesn't expect it to live. Against the odds, the tiny creature survives and thrives in Chloe's

care, and in the long days of lockdown, they become accustomed to one another. She leaves the hare free to roam the house and garden, and eventually the day comes when she can jump the garden wall and meet the wilder hares beyond... And Chloe has to return to work in London. This could have been the end of a beautiful episode, but the hare has a surprise in store. Beautifully and thoughtfully written, this is the story of an extraordinary relationship of trust. Gradually Chloe comes to see the countryside around her in a completely different way - instead of simply a view, the fields become home to many creatures, with their accustomed routes and habits, and the perils of their existence become apparent.

I gave this to my 13-year-old son and 74-year-old father to read and both absolutely loved it. A beautiful book.





As a frequent insomniac, I found this beautifully written book truly inspiring and comforting, it offers a thoughtful, imaginative riposte to the 'healthy sleep zealots' who strike fear into the heart of the sleepless!



Shakespeare's Starlings: Three Act Tragedy

Hey y'all, I'm mailing in this month's article from my vacation at Bodega Bay on the foggy Pacific coast of California. It may be all organic coffee, art galleries, surfer dudes and flip-flops but this quaint coastal community is notorious for being the location for a most sinister film: 'The Birds' (1963)

Alfred Hitchcock has long gone but flocks of the film's stars still sit ominously perched on telegraph wires as if unaware that the portly director yelled 'cut' 56 years ago. But unlike the local hummingbirds, phoebes and chickadees these particular birds look reassuringly familiar to me.

They are Sturnus vulgaris, the European Starling, the same species we see wheeling around Brighton's West Pier in their dramatic amoeboid murmurations. And, like me, they don't really belong here. The Starlings are here thanks to Henry IV. Well, 'Henry IV Part 1' majority of them died. But on March 6, 1890, to be precise.

Act I: London, 1597. William Shakespeare scribbles the word 'Starling' in his epic tale of power and treachery. With that feathered flourish of his guill, Shakespeare would unknowingly be the author of an ecological catastrophe that would play out until the present day.

Act II: New York, 1877. Enter stage right Eugene Schieffelin, a socialite who would later be remembered as 'an eccentric at best, a lunatic at worst'. He chaired the American Acclimatization Society, a group which, despite their nationalistic sounding

name, were very keen to welcome foreigners. In fact, their aim was to import animals of economic or cultural interest from the Old World to the New. Schieffelin, a big fan of Shakespeare, had a dream: to populate America with every bird mentioned in Shakespeare's writings.

And so the bard's birds were boxed up in England and brought to New York where Skylarks, Pied Wagtails, Bullfinches, Nightingales, Chaffinches and many more were 'liberated' into Central Park. The 60 Starlings (a bird mentioned only once by Shakespeare) were released in Central Park and they fared better. Much better. Today there are around 200 million of them across the United States.

Act III: United States, present day. The story of Schieffelin's Shakespearian motivation may just be an urban legend but the legacy of his misguided American Acclimatization Society is very real.

Today European Starlings are widely vilified by Americans as aggressive pests that have destroyed precious ecosystems and turfed out native species. Which is pretty rich

coming from a bunch of invasive Europeans who have been doing just that for the past few centuries! And since then there have been many who have appeared hellbent on dismantling this country's environmental regulations which protect wildlife, the landscape and our planet.

But sure, let's blame the birds. As Mr Shakespeare (almost) once wrote, 'The fault, dear Brutus, is not in our Starlings, / But in ourselves'.

Butterfly numbers are badly down this year, we have decided to boost their food plants in Steyning asking you to 'Create a NectarCafe in Your Garden'. We are giving away a selection of Butterfly Bushes (Buddleia Davidii). This is totally non allergenic (source Arizona Uni.) this is why it is a top nectar source for bees and butterflies and a valuable now have established butterfly bushes and addition to gardens. 5 different colours for you to choose. Buddleias can be pruned hard once they are established, so can be grown as a shrub or fully grown tree.

We will give some hollies to encourage the Holly Blue butterfly to your garden, plus marjoram (origanum), a great perennial pollinator and useful herb.

I hope some managed to get across to Gravetye on a Thursday 09:00 - 11:00 for a free visit to the home of the victorian gardener William Robinson, father of wildlife gardening. We did, it was stunning, a fabulously curated selection of flowering plants, perennials, and annuals, exotic trees and shrubs creating an amazing spectacle , as well as its walled circular vegetable and cutting garden for the Hotel. They are starting to cut back their extensive areas of wild flower meadows and long grass such a boon for nature. We are doing the same in our re wilded garden as seeds are now set. We leave the cut grass a few days for seeds to drop so they can germinate for next year.

Then rake it up to keep fertility low as needed by wild plants. We are sad to see these go, such a joy to see most of our grass areas covered in wild flowers, with a consequential increase in slo-worms, bees and butterflies These have increased here, but smaller, even though it has been a bad year nationwide We lots of marjoram, wild flowers everywhere. So not much work to do as nature does it for us, what a joy to live amongst it. The butterfly charities have asked us all to leave any plants still flowering, to feed up our overwintering butterflies before they go into hibernation.

In the latest SWT Newsletter (15th Aug) Lydia Baxter's article 'Bless this Mess' says that untidy natural processes are good for wildlife and shares tips on making our gardens more messy.

We are asking the P.C. for permission to layer the hedge we have planted at Abbey Road. The hedge has to be grown tall, not cut, just this once, so it can be bent over to weave into the hedge. After laying, the hedge will

only be 2-3 FEET HIGH WITH GAPS, and can be kept cut to 3ft or whatever height residents want. This is a traditional craft used for centuries to thicken hedges. This will be highly beneficial for wildlife, particularly providing sites for nesting birds, and giving increased cover at the bottom of the hedge. It will enhance the look of this lovely area to have a traditionally laid hedge. SFT is happy to pay for this work which will considerably benefit nature and the community.

In the latest Weald to Waves Newsletter they say how wildlife corridor hedges provide benefits locally, but are integral to the larger Weald to Waves corridor, creating essential links between habitats and allowing species to move and disperse across a fragmented landscape, therefore bolstering resilience and continuity of local ecosystems.

The State of the Adur: the good news and the bad

GREENING STEYNING · BRAMBER · BEEDING

The River Adur is a precious natural resource and one of the defining features of our local landscape. But what sort of shape is it in?

The picture is decidedly mixed. We hear worrying reports about pollution in the river. In the longer term, there's rising sea levels to think about, as the effects of climate change kick in. But at the same time there's been encouraging news of a number of ambitious initiatives along the river designed to protect nature and enhance the Adur's role as a wildlife corridor.

To help put this all in perspective, Greening Steyning has invited local rivers expert, Pete King, to give a talk on 'the State of the Adur'.

Pete is Director of the **Ouse and Adur Rivers Trust**, an organisation set up in 2011 to protect and enhance the quality of these two rivers. He knows the Adur from top to bottom and is uniquely placed to provide us with an overview of both the good news and the bad. He'll also be able to suggest ideas on what we in the local community can do to put pressure on tackling pollution and to get behind initiatives that will improve the health of our local river ecosystem.

As part of his talk he'll be updating us on what's happening at **Bramber Brooks**, with the new wildlife ponds, or 'scrapes', that have

been dug this summer by the Environment Agency. He's also be able to brief us on latest developments with the Adur River Recovery Project, and the Weald to Waves initiative, two of the most ambitious landscape-level nature recovery projects in the country.

On the less pleasant side, he'll be sharing latest data on sewage and farm run-off in the river and talking about why it's happening and what it's going to take to deal with these.

Since we're focusing on the river, we'll also be giving an update on the White Bridge Link project to connect up Steyning and Upper Beeding with an all-weather foot and cycle path. This was stopped in its tracks when the bridge was closed last summer when structural defects were discovered. But there's better news on the horizon, with a

new bridge due to be installed in 2025.

Everyone with an interest in the river is invited to join us. The talk is at the Steyning Centre on Wednesday 30th October, with doors and bar opening at 19:30.

October Gardening Journal

With the changing light and cooler weather our gardens start to fade. It's a slow process through October as there is still colour in our borders as well as the changing colours of our trees and shrubs. It can be a busy time for the gardener as there is often lots to think about for next Spring, Bulb planting and making changes to the parts of gardens we still feel needs more work are just two of the jobs that are good to do now. We are not always presented with the best of the weather but sometimes I think that's one of the parts of gardening I enjoy most being outside in all elements experiencing some of what Mother Nature throws at us.

The genus Pennisetum comprises about 80 species, mostly perennial, from sub-tropical and warm temperate regions of the world. They are highly ornamental grasses and generally most are clump forming, however there are some that are rhizomatous and have a habit of spreading quickly through your borders. The neat tussocks and mini fountains of fox tail like flowers have earned them their name "Fountain Grass".

Pennisetum Black Beauty has to be one of my favourites from the Pennisetum family. It is a clump-forming grass which grows to around 1m tall with narrow, arching green leaves. From summer into autumn, tall stems bear dark purple to black flowers on bottlebrush-like heads. These flowers are dramatic in both shape and colour and when the flowers have gone over the seedheads persist throughout the winter and with the dried foliage can be an asset during the colder months when brown becomes a more valuable asset in the garden.

In the right position, Pennisetums are pretty much trouble-free. The best time of year for planting grasses is the Spring, they can sulk a bit if planted in the autumn. When planting, consider how to bring out the best of the plant. Pennisetum Black Beauty is strong enough to stand alone as a specimen but can also be mix well with others too. Young plants should be given space to breathe, and surrounding planting should be controlled until the plants have established.

Most Pennisetums can be easily propagated by seed and fresh seed will often germinate quickly. They should also be potted on during • Sow sweet peas under glass.

the warmer months when they are actively growing as they generally don't like their roots sitting in cold, soggy soil. You can also propagate through division, but the same rule applies – do this during the growing season and ensure to water well after to ensure they recover well from the shock of the brutal treatment of being cut in half.

The popularity of ornamental grasses has never been more popular, and it is no surprise why, they add impact, colour and texture and are an important addition to any low maintenance planting scheme. Pennisetum Black Beauty is one of the best and combined with late summer perennials like Aster, Helenium and Sedums will provide colour well into autumn and early winter.

Jobs to do this month include: Ornamental Garden:

- Mulch borders with compost if not done in the spring.
- · Continue deadheading if weather is mild.
- Remove fallen leaves from Roses to prevent blackspot.
- · Continue to tidy borders of weeds and leaves.
- Transplant any plants that need to be
- · Plant spring bulbs such as Daffodils etc. But NOT tulips - wait until November to avoid tulip blight.
- · Lift and divide perennials.
- Plant up containers etc for winter bedding displays.
- · Apply autumn lawn feed etc.
- Now is a good time to plant trees and shrubs - the soil is moist and warm.

- Can lift summer flowering bulbs / tubers and overwinter in greenhouse or can heavily mulch plants and leave in the ground. Eg gladioli, dahlia, canna.
- Cut back herbaceous perennials as they die back.
- Prune climbing roses to avoid wind rock.
- Refill bird feeders regularly.
- Install insect hotels/log piles.

Vegetable Garden:

Begin planting garlic

- Apply fleece to late season crops when frost is forecast.
- · Lift and divide rhubarb.
- · Clear away old foliage of strawberries to prevent pest and diseases.
- · Pot up herbs and take into frost free greenhouse or windowsill to continue cropping through the winter.
- · Complete planting onion setts and plant out spring cabbage.
- Harvest squash and pumpkin if not already done so.



Rewarding Customs of the Medieval Manor

There was a certain amount of give and take in a medieval manor

The same man who we met in an earlier article, the one who was required, in the fourteenth century, to seek the permission of the lord of the manor to give his daughter in marriage, could expect various benefits when he worked extra hours on the lord's demesne farm at harvest time.

The document called the 'custumal' sets out that 'He shall come with two men to one harvest boonwork to reap the lord's corn, and have his food of the lord; at breakfast wheaten bread and ale, at dinner wheaten bread, ale, soup, beef and mutton or other meat, so that it be of two kinds, and cheese, at supper each of them shall have a wastell price ½ d., and one drink price ¼ d, with two herrings, or cheese to the value of 4d.' The 'Boonwork' was the extra work done at harvest time and 'wastells', sometimes also referred to as 'brokbred', were a form of cake made of fine flour.


The 'custumal' was very precise about everyone's roles and dues. The swineherd (or pig-keeper), for example, 'If the lord has the pigs killed at his house for the larder, he (the swineherd) shall help drive them to the lord's house, and shall have the issues of the third best pig. If the pigs are fat and are to be sold he shall help drive them to market, and shall have 12d. if they are sold. All the year he shall have three of his own pigs with the lord's, both in pannage and elsewhere, save that

they shall not be at the barn with the lord's pigs, and that he shall not have corn for fattening them.'

At Steyning, in 1338, the swineherd was the man with the tricky job of herding 23 pigs to Warminghurst and 38 piglets the twenty miles to Warnham each year: no easy task I imagine. Moreover, in the autumn, Steyning's pigs were taken to a place which we haven't yet been able to identify, called 'La Mermesse', for pannage – that is to say, for feeding from the woodland floor. One of the more curious provisos in the 'custumal' was that for Ralph atte Mulle. Ralph rented a watermill and 13 acres, and could, in exchange for 'scouring the watercourse from the mill as far as the path which goes towards Bramber Castle, have the grass on each side of the said watercourse as far as an ox standing in the middle of the water can

reach with his mouth.'
One can imagine
Ralph selecting his
largest ox to reach
out to the furthest
and juiciest piece
of grass on the side
of the watercourse,
as justification for
some free grazing or
haymaking.

The summer chores of cutting the hay and reaping the corn were particularly regarded as important tasks on the manor. William Cosyn, for instance, 'ought to find 1 scythe for mowing the meadow.' For that he was rewarded, along with the other 'customers' (the workers who, by

custom, were liable for work on the manor farm) with '1 wether [a male sheep] worth 12d. and 1 cheese worth 4d., and he ought to have bread for two sufficient repasts, viz., at breakfast bread and cheese.' Then there was William Calewe who, when he was picking apples for cider making in the autumn, was allowed to have 'daily 10 apples at home while collecting the said apples.' And yet another tenant, who had the job of cutting down a tree, could 'have the bark by custom,' and 'shall have a quarter of 1 loaf as is customary while he is drawing the manure.'

Although all these checks and balances provided a few benefits for the tenants, everything was weighted in the favour of the lord of the manor – except that, rather surprisingly perhaps, at least some of the tenants had a week's break from working on the lord's demesne farm 'at the Nativity of the Lord, at Easter and at Pentecost.'




