New Walking and Cycling Survey Launched

What would it take to make Steyning, Bramber and Beeding more walking and cycling friendly? And how can it be made easier to get out and about for those with wheelchairs, mobility scooters and pushchairs?

These are the questions being asked in a new survey has just been launched. Backed by the three **Parish Councils**, the survey will feed into a long term Walking and Cycling Plan being developed for our local community. This will be used to guide future investments in footpath and cycle path improvements, and in traffic calming and other potential measures.

The whole purpose is to tip the balance towards more active forms of travel, so our streets feel safer and it becomes an easier choice to leave the car at home. At present, Steyning, Bramber and Beeding are blessed with a fairly extensive network of footpaths and twittens. But these paths do not always feel easy or safe to navigate, especially if you have young children or mobility issues. Provision for cyclists is also guite patchy, with few dedicated cycle paths and a number of hazardous crossings and busy roads to negotiate.

The survey asks you to identify current danger spots that put you off cycling and walking, and say what you think would be the most effective improvements that could be made. A number of suggestions are set out, but there is plenty of space for you to add your own ideas.

The survey is especially timely given the plans afoot to rebuild and expand Steyning Grammar School, and the recent approval of outline plans to build up to 285 new houses on the Glebe Farm estate, just across the bypass from Steyning. Both of these developments would have a major impact on local travel patterns.

The Walking and Cycling Plan is being developed by a Working Party under the umbrella of Steyning & District Community Partnership. As well as representatives from all three Parish Councils it includes other interested groups such as Greening Steyning, Bramber & Beeding, and the Steyning &

And they will all need funding. So nothing is guaranteed! But the thinking is that by having a well worked out Walking and Cycling Plan as a framework, this will carry weight with local planning authorities and potential funders and make progressing these ambitions a lot easier.

Your ideas are important! Please take 10 minutes to fill in the online survey. The more responses received the more weight the resulting plan will carry.





November: Steyning Community Orchard update



Now that the apple picking season is over, it's a good time to look STEYNING COMMUNITY back at the season just past and reflect on how it went ORCHARD

There was a sense of déjà vu early in the year as we once again had a cool damp windy spell in Spring when there were almost Farmer's Market. no flying insects, so essential for good pollination. But as the weather improved, the insects emerged and what seemed like being a poor year, ended up a pretty good one.

Many of the trees we manage in our orchards are ones that we have planted over the last 9 years, and these are now beginning to become mature and cropping well. But as often happens, especially on the Memorial Playing Field orchard, the apples are picked long before they are ripe, by passers-by who can't resist just trying one!

That is something we can't control – it is a Community Orchard after all. Hopefully as the trees become fully mature, there will be enough apples for everyone to try.

In mid-September we held our Apple Juicing event. This was well supported as ever, with lots of families bringing their apples along to press into delicious apple juice. We also



pressed our own apples, and sold over 35 litres of that juice at the October Steyning

For the second year running we were invited to the Weald and Downland Living Museum at Singleton near Chichester to do an Apple Juicing demonstration. We had hundreds of visitors and were kept busy all day. One of our group is a volunteer at the Museum, and some of the apples that we pressed were from trees that we had helped to source and plant for the Museum in recent years.

We continue to produce our own grafted apple trees for planting in our orchards and to sell to other orchards, and individuals, to raise funds for the Community Orchard. We have found homes for over 30 of our grafted trees this year.

We will be holding our annual Wassail again on Saturday 18th January 2025. More about that in the January 'Your Steyning'.

Finally, regular readers will know that we have our own apple called 'Steyning Scarlet'. We found this tree growing at the side of the by-pass, registered it officially as Steyning Scarlet and have been grafting and selling these trees for several years. One customer sent us this picture of some of the apples from his tree. They look (and are) delicious!







Joint Parish Youth Club – JPYC

This month we are proud to be launching two brand new youth club sessions open to youth from the ages of 9+, in the joint parishes of Steyning, Upper Beeding and Bramber. The Joint Parishes' new provision (Joint Parish

Youth Club – JPYC for short) is in-house for the first time with Lead Youth Worker, Vicky Heales at the helm and a team of qualified Youth Support Workers and Volunteers.

It comes after an extremely successful trial week of activities, held in the summer where children and young people were invited to take part in various activities, including military bootcamp, in partnership with Places Leisure and street dance. The JPYC partnered with Greening Steyning's Repair Café to run a session on upcycling where budding fashion designers turned old garments into bags. They have also been working with the Steyning Downlands Scheme developing construction and conservation skills for youth, creating a stag beetle hotel which now has a permanent home on the Wiston estate.

The next few weeks will see JPYC conducting surveys for youth in the area, alongside Steyning Downlands Scheme, distributing flyers and planning for their launch w/c 21 October!

You might see them out and about

Vicky's main aim is to make Youth Club a safe, nurturing and welcoming place, which responds to and meets the needs of the community. A space where young people on the cusp of adulthood can be heard, valued, connect with others and find friendship and purpose.

As a qualified Inclusive Dance Teacher, at the age of sixteen, Vicky was given roles of responsibility at her own youth club after staff noticed an interest in dance.

She completed 200 hours as a Millennium Volunteer and led the dance troupe at club, who performed at various local events. She then went on to achieve a BA (hons) Dance degree, a Masters qualification in Dance



Writing & Criticism and has 10 years+ running her own business and managing a nationwide team of instructors. She attributes this success to Youth Club:

'I know first-hand just how important it is to have a safe place to go, where your voice is heard and where you are inspired to make something of your life, with the support of trusted adults. A bad day doesn't mean a bad life, and it is advice like this that can have a lasting impact on a young person. Growth takes time and stepping into youth club for the first time can be the planting of that seed. I certainly wouldn't have taken this path in life had I not attended youth club myself, where I was recognised as an individual and given roles of responsibility within club, to develop my skills'.

Jonathan Coe

The Proof of My Innocence by Jonathan Coe

Penguin Books, hardback £20

An ambitious, witty, multi-layered novel which somehow mashes up cosy crime, memoir, autofiction and Coe's signature political satire.

Phyl, a middle-class twenty-something, has returned to the family nest to figure out what to do with her life. When Chris, an old family friend, comes to stay, Phyl is intrigued by his tales of the shadowy right wing thinktank he's investigating for his blog, which has its origins in a Cambridge University salon that Chris, and Phyl's mother attended, back in the 80's. Chris goes off to cover the sinister machinations at the 'TrueCon' ultraright conference at a luxury hotel in the Cotswolds...only to end up dead. Phyl and Rashida, Chris's daughter, sense foul play and pick up the breadcrumb trail of clues left by Chris's research.

Coe delights in playing with genres, as this Russian doll of a novel, containing books within books within books, gradually uncovers the mystery, revealing a story of a forgotten literary enigma while adeptly satirising the right-wing political establishment.

Murakami's first novel in 6 years sees him returning to an alternate reality created in his earlier novel Hard-Boiled Wonderland at the End of the World.

This is a long, gentle novel which unwinds

slowly, beginning with a story of teenage love, narrated by an unnamed 17-year-old boy whose girlfriend bewitches him with tales of an alternate reality where her 'true self' can be found, working in a library of dreams in a city with shifting walls. One day the girl disappears, leaving no trace, and our narrator is haunted by her absence throughout his adult life until, one day, he wakes to find himself in this city, taking up the post of Dream Reader alongside his lost love. Much of Part 1 is set in this unsettling shifting netherworld, where people have no shadows and unicorns stroll the streets. In Part 2, the 'meat' of the novel, our narrator has found his way back to the 'real' world, leaving his job in Tokyo to become head librarian in a remote town. Slowly the relationships he develops there, with elderly, skirt-wearing male librarian, an autistic savant teenage boy, and an attractive coffee shop owner, begin to heal his yearning for his lost love. Will be ever reconcile his real and shadow selves?

Elliptical, mesmerising, mysterious, this haunting novel investigates themes of loneliness, aging, and the universal human desire for finding deeper meaning in a shallow world.

FIRE by John Boyne Transworld Hardback £12.99

The third novel in Boyne's 'Elements' quartet really ratchets up the heat. It's a shocking, unsettling meditation on the nature of evil and the nature/ nurture debate which I suspect will be highly controversial as - trigger warning – it

d contains scenes of child abuse.

The 2 previous novels in the series followed characters who were in some way complicit to a crime they did not actually commit.



With FIRE, we move to a character who is unambiguously guilty. Freya is a glacial, assured and very successful surgeon in her mid-thirties, who specialises in burn grafts. She is comfortably off, single, dedicated to her job and has no personal relationships outside her work colleagues. Gradually, through a series of flashbacks, we discover that as a child she was the victim of horrific bullying and abuse, perpetrated upon her by two teenage boys.


Outside of her life-saving work at the hospital, Freya leads a darker double life. She cruises the city, visiting acts of retribution for the crimes she suffered as a child. But one day she goes too far and risks losing everything as a web of suspicion falls upon her.

It is an unsettling experience to read a novel from the perspective of such a chilling character. A compulsive, quick read with LOTS for book groups to discuss.

Jays



Each autumn a lot of my conversations go like this: '*This morning I saw a weird pink and blue bird on my lawn.*' Me: '*It's a Jay.*' '*There's a parrot on my bird table!*' Me: '*It's a Jay.*' '*I've just seen...*' Me: '*It's a Jay'*. Spotting such an exotic looking bird in the back garden gets even my most wildlife-averse friends reaching for the Blencowe bird identification hotline. Yet despite looking like it has flown in direct from the jungles of Costa Rica, the Jay lives in Sussex all year round. For most of the year it withdraws to the woodlands and leads an elusive life amongst the leaves. But in October it is time for the Jay to step out of the shadows.

Jays look fabulous. With extravagant pink plumage, a drooping black moustache and a snazzy electric blue flash through the wings, it's no surprise that the eminent Sussex naturalist, W.H. Hudson, called it 'the British Bird of Paradise'. Surprisingly, it's a member of the crow family. But while the related Ravens, Rooks, Crows and Jackdaws all wear black funereal feathers, the Jay obviously didn't get the memo about the dress code!

Gather the Crows for a family portrait and the Jay stands out like Danny La Rue in full drag amongst a crowd of coal miners. But, when the Jay opens its beak, it reveals its family heritage. The song of the Jay is a rough, rasping, nails-down-the-blackboard shriek, which would make any Crow proud.

The reason we see more Jays in the autumn is because they are busy. Jays are nuts about acorns and at this time of the year their favourite food is in plentiful supply. But the Jay is a clever bird. Aware that there are lean times ahead it starts making a long-term

investment for surviving the winter. With up to nine acorns jammed in its beak and throat, the Jay flies far from the woodlands and hides these nuts in nooks and under dead leaves. With an impressive ability to remember exactly where he has stashed them, the Jay will return, and tuck into these life-saving larders in the cold days of winter.

I've employed a similar strategy many times at parties! Faced with a full buffet at the start of the night, I hide a few piles of crisps and vol-au-vents behind curtains and cushions to help me get through the evening.

One Jay can store up to 5000 acorns in a season. Not all are remembered and retrieved and from these lost acorns, mighty Oaks grow. I often wonder how many of the huge Oaks we see in Sussex were originally planted by Jays. Through the centuries these birds have been architects of the English countryside: a landscape created by the forgetfulness of a pink crow.

November: Steyning for Trees

Thank you to all who came to our Stall at the Market and took plants specifically aimed at helping to halt the decline in butterfly numbers which have been happening for so many years. This year, as you know, has been especially bad. The annual garden butterfly count dropped to 7 from 12 - a very steep decline.



All the plants are great for pollinators, providing nectar and food plus shelter. The Buddleia are totally non allergenic (source Arizona university) which is why it is so sought after by butterflies and bees, hence its name the Butterfly Bush. Prune it hard after it's established if you don't want it to get too leggy. It is pretty tough!

Hedge Laying:

We are hoping next year to be laying the first hedge we planted at Abbey Road if the Parish Council gives us permission. SFT will be paying for this work which will considerably aid nature recovery in this area, Laid hedges provide much better nesting sites for birds. This is an ancient craft, Caesar mentioned woven hedges 2,000 years ago.

The hedge needs to be tall at the moment, during laying it is bent horizontally so there's plenty to weave in and out. Thus creating a thicker, more lasting structure, When you bend a branch horizontally shoots grow stronger vertically, hence the increased protection for birds. After laying it will be less than 3ft high and can be kept to any height.

Nature Recovery around Steyning:

We are so pleased to be working with an ever growing number of landowners and farmers, large and small who understand the importance of supporting endangered species that are part of our ecosystem. providing a better future for them and us. We will be helping Angela and Liam planting a long hedge on their land, developing it as yet another haven for wildlife. These areas are so valuable, such as Shona Halsall's family field, with more varied trees supporting a greater number of species. Plus Disease Resistant Elms Mark Stenning's wonderful Broadbourne egg farm, (Delicious eggs!). Another hedge here, plus planting some goat willow, host plant to the Purple Emperor butterfly, UK's largest. Small leaved limes, Acer campestre etc. Helping him develop his pond already abuzz with dragonflies and damselflies Plus another disease resistant elm he already has one or ours growing so well. The Catholic Church, another hedge, completing the third side surrounding their land.

Our wonderful volunteers have been busy looking after the hedges (wildlife corridors) already planted, Cutting back the competing grass round these varied plants Including blackthorn which is a host plant to the Brown hairstreak butterfly. Our maintenance work is considerable now, but will tail off as the hedges become established.



November Gardening Journal

At this time of year an autumnal walk can be so much more invigorating than an afternoon in the garden but it's not quite time to pack up the tools just yet I'm afraid. November is the best time of year to start thinking about plans for next year while everything is still fresh in your mind. The ground starts to soften, making it a perfect time for digging over, transplanting, and splitting plants to propagate. As the season turns, it's all about the leaves, but it's not just about their beauty as they fade and fall, it's about the mess they leave on the ground too. Whether it's going for an Autumn Walk or cleaning up the leaves, enjoy the beautiful, autumnal colours before the cold sets in.

Some plants really come into their own in the autumn and a good show of autumn leaf colour is hard to beat. In England and Northern Europe, we rarely experience the vast displays of colour that other parts of the world enjoy. However, we do have enough varieties of trees and shrubs available that help us to orchestrate our own end of the season finale worthy of any landscape. There are some spectacularly vibrant trees at this time of year, but one of the very best is Liquidambar.

American sweetgum (Liquidambar styraciflua), also known as American storax, is a deciduous tree that is native to North America and Central America. It is recognizable by the combination of its fivepointed star-shaped leaves, which are similar in appearance to maple leaves, and its hard spiky fruits too.

The trees genus name, Liquidambar, was

first given by Linnaeus in 1753 from the

maple-like leaves turn from green to glowing shades of orange, red, yellow, or purple. The species is a tall-growing deciduous tree that needs plenty of space to grow with trees taking around 15-20 years to mature. Because of its size it's not really suited to the smaller garden, however, many different cultivars have been bred since it was introduced, offering a range of features such as varying autumn leaf colours, variegated foliage, a narrower or columnar habit, and a smaller overall size too. The narrowest variety is 'Slender Silhouette', which forms a tight column 1-1.5m wide. 'Lane Roberts', 'Slender Silhouette' and 'Worplesdon' have all • Scarify lawns. been awarded the RHS (Royal Horticultural Society) Award of Garden Merit.

While not everyone will have the space to plant a Liquidamber, those that do I would highly recommend using it as a specimen tree – its strong enough to stand on its one and doesn't need neighbours to dilute its magnificent stature. It has also been known to be trained as a Pleached Tree or an Umbrella Tree too so if you have a little less space and are keen to include it in your scheme then perhaps this may be the best way to go.

Jobs To Do This Month Include: **Ornamental Garden:**

- · Part prune roses to prevent windrock.
- Continue to tidy borders if weather permits.
- Final cut for lawns if no frosts.
- Remove fallen leaves.
- Cutback spent foliage and flowers of

herbaceous perennials.

- Leave the seedheads of grasses like Miscanthus to provide winter structure.
- Continue to lay turf for new lawns avoid frosty days if possible.
- Remove surplus dead leaves from ponds.
- Complete planting of bulbs.
- Mulch borders especially borderline hardy perennials.
- Plant bare root shrubs and roses.
- · Prune long stems of roses to avoid windrock.
- Take hard wood cuttings of roses and other deciduous shrubs.
- · Keep off lawns in wet and frosty weather.

Vegetable Garden:

- Begin winter pruning of fruit trees.
- Plant fruit trees, soft fruit and cane fruit.
- Plant garlic cloves.
- Apply grease bands around trunks of fruit trees to protect from winter months.
- Apply a good layer of compost / manure to bare areas of ground.
- · Protect salad plants under cloches/ fleece etc.
- · Clear spent old plants and compost of disease free.

Church-going Memories

In 1921 the Rev E W Cox, Steyning's vicar, received a letter from a Miss Kate Penfold with some recollections about the Church. She described herself as "a member of a very old Sussex family" and was clearly an elderly lady when she wrote her letter.

There were several dateable memories in her letter. She described how, on Sundays, she would sit in her grandmother's pew when visiting Steyning. This is a reference to the time when the great, the good and the 'middle sort' of Steyning would pay to reserve a particular 'box' pew for their family's use - this system of allocating pews being dispensed with in 1864. Her grandmother had died before that, in 1858.

She also mentions 'the three-decker pulpit with the clerk's desk beneath it' which was positioned rather awkwardly in the central aisle of the nave. It is shown in the plan drawn in preparation for the construction of galleries over the north and south aisles of the nave in 1832. A new pulpit, relocated to

beside the north chancel arch, was installed in 1857.

She then added "I remember that there was a little orchestra, which was far more interesting to the performers and more likely to induce them to become Churchgoers than the wheezv harmonium which displaced them." What she described as a wheezy harmonium was more grandly identified as a new organ by the vicar in the order of service to mark its unveiling in 1853.

A very early photograph taken in the 1870's shows that the access to the space beneath the tower when Miss Penfold knew it, was through a rather narrow arch - very similar indeed to the existing arches to the north and south of the chancel. Miss Penfold's sharp eye had seen the shortcomings of this arch. 'The children sat in tiers of seats,' she said, either in the belfry [i.e.at the foot of the tower beyond the arch] or just in front. Poor children they could neither hear nor see anything and, when they became too restless, some official would distribute condign punishment to the offenders'.

Her other remarks are harder to date and have led to some uncertainty and speculation. Miss Penfold claimed to have

> remembered 'the Church when there was no font to be seen there', and that 'Mr. Medland (Steyning's vicar between 1840 and 1882) found the old font'. Whilst the font was missing she explained that 'For baptisms an 'occasional table' was brought in (from the vicarage?) and an old china bowl was placed thereon'. Once found, the font 'was set up close to the Church door (properly enough as far as symbolism is concerned), but this position was

found to be very draughty and I have seen many baptisms at the 'table with its basin' standing just in front of the belfry, whilst the font stood unused at the door, being made a receptacle for odds and ends of various sorts - dusters, brushes etc.'.

'The case of the missing font' probably began when it was damaged during building work. The repair to one corner of the 12th century Purbeck Marble bowl is still evident but the Medieval base which supported it, and which can be seen in a sketch done after the galleries were constructed in 1832, disappeared. Perhaps it too had been damaged. It re-appeared momentarily between 1907 and 1915 but has gone again.

The marble basin was re-established on a new base after it had been repaired - though

exactly when that happened is a moot point. We know, though, that it has been shuffled around within the church. In 1832 it was beneath the tower arch but, when Miss Penfold recalls it, it was evidently positioned as close to the south door as possible, where it was overshadowed by the south gallery. This was so inconvenient that it was eventually moved back to its central position, only to be shunted to the side again when the galleries were removed in 1906.

A hundred years ago it was once again moved back to its central position, and there it has remained.

Plastic bottle tops (including trigger sprays, Tetra Pak, carton and milk bottle lids) as long as they are attached to squashed empty bottles. Medication blister packs.

Supermarkets: All soft plastics. Used water filters (BRITA water filters at most Sainsbury's and Tescos. Some will accept any brand).




