Real Boxing Day Beef

Of course Boxing Day lunch wouldn't be the same without a traditional roast beef joint. But do you know where yours has come from?

Pop along to Steyning Butchers and ask for a Greyfriars Dexter, and you'll know exactly where it's come from:

The flower-rich grasslands of the Steyning Downland, less than a mile away!



Frances's small herd of Dexter cattle are vital team members in conserving our flower-rich ancient chalk grassland. Our Conservation Volunteers work tirelessly, cutting down scrub supermarket breeds) they go to a local and brambles, while the Dexters ... well, they eat. But without their continuous munching, the Rifle Range would soon be covered with scrub!

Dexters are a hardy rare breed, unbelievably docile and able to thrive on chalk pasture. By contrast, modern breeds like the Charolais are used to slurping up Italian Rye grass,

pumped up with Nitrogen fertilizer. Our Dexters aren't fed antibiotics, wormers or anything other than South Downs wild flowers (and a bit of salt).

When the Dexters finally reach full weight (which can take double the time of the butchery, and then down the road to Steyning Butchers for local sale. Their food miles are a tiny fraction of the supermarket variety. What's more, research shows that grass-fed beef has big health benefits: It's lower in saturated fats and higher in Omega-3 than grain-fed beef . . . and it tastes totally different too - like proper beef should

December 24: I'm scrambling...

I'm scrambling through the woodland undergrowth, anxious, sweating and clutching a 2kg pouch of white powder and a spoon. I may look like some Colombian cocaine smuggler, but I've got the perfect excuse for the police: 'I'm researching my parish magazine article'. I've been writing articles Sussex parish magazines for many years and I've received some lovely comments from many people - thank you. It's nice to know they are being read and enjoyed.

When I was a kid, I would read loads of wildlife books with names like 'the amateur naturalist' (not to be confused with 'the amateur naturist', a mistake you only make once). Each book promised to make you a wildlife detective and was filled with tips on tracking mammals in the countryside.

Most British mammals are nocturnal and, after centuries of persecution, all of them are understandably rather wary of humans. We hardly ever see them. Yet these invisible animals leave behind tantalising clues which let us know they really exist: droppings, nibbled nuts, pellets. But the biggest giveaway of all are their footprints.

Primitive mammals (such as Hedgehogs, Stoats, Badgers and you) are plantigrades. We stroll about on the soles of our feet and have five toes. When we run, we use our toes and the balls of our feet. For the mammals who spend a lot of time running and jumping this basic mammalian plantigrade foot has evolved and adapted over time.

Some animals have lost a toe (Foxes, cats, dogs, Hares) while the real gymnasts, such as deer, leap around on two toes, and horses



race on just one toe enclosed in a hoof. Like Sherlock Holmes with a foot fetish, you can examine each footprint's formula of toes, claws and pads to deduce just who has been sneaking around at night.

Wildlife Trust

My books told me that, once you find a footprint, the best way to capture it is to make a cast – which explains why I'm crouched here in the undergrowth excitedly mixing up plaster of Paris powder and pouring it into a footprint in the muddy woodland floor. I've always wanted to do this since I was a kid but, well, I guess life got in the way.

Now, sat proudly on my desk, I have my first footprint cast: a Badger (with five toes, a wide pad and obvious claws). And somewhere out there is a Badger completely unaware that its footprint has created a deeper enjoyment of wildlife and inspired someone to preserve it. Which now I think about it, is all I have hoped for from these articles too. I hope I've made an impression.

Power Naps: New Research Uncovers Big Benefits in Short Bursts of Sleep

LIFE from OLD WOOD

We are so pleased that Guy Sanderson offered to write this article for us and is doing such great environmental work at Gatewick in the centre of Steyning. He has a great love and knowledge of trees.

'Traditionally late autumn has always been bonfire month as gardeners seek to tidy away old wood and debris and enjoy the heat of a bonfire with a toffee apple or two.

Over the past month at Gatewick House, behind the parish church, we've been gathering up piles homes, as well as overwintering butterflies, of dead branches, leaves and hedge cuttings to start something that we hope will be much more for spiders, hedgehogs (which sadly are less exciting, more beneficial and enduring than a bonfire.

If you have walked along the edge of Abbey Road Conservation Area recently and looked across (as I hope you might), you'll have seen the start of a long, snaking brown 'dead hedge'. It's not finished yet, but when it is, we hope that it will be a glorious, vertical pile of

Over time, the wood at the bottom of the hedge will rot down, aided by tiny fungi, bacteria, slugs (yes we'll even be encouraging those!), snails, springtails, millipedes, earwigs, woodlice and beetles. We're hoping, in time, to find that we've attracted the musk beetle, the wonderfully named red-necked click beetle, and Britain's biggest, the staghorn beetles, as the hedge settles down.

Meanwhile the dry wood at the top of the pile will attract wood wasps and solitary bees which both drill into old dry wood to make moths and ladybirds. All of these are then prev and less common in this country), shrews, frogs, toads, lizards, slow-worms and possibly grass snakes. Small birds like robins, wrens,

> dunnocks and even blackbirds all like the tangled maze and hideaways in such a hedge and, once it's finished, we'll enhance this by planting honeysuckle along the whole hedge.

> To match this dead hedge, we will start next month planting a further 200m

stretch of conventional native hedging with holly, hawthorn, blackthorn, hazel, field maple, hornbeam, dog-roses along the back of gardens manage without you all? from Shooting Field and Bowman's Close.

Our hope is thus to join the amazing work that's been going on at the Abbey Road Conservation Area and the work in the churchyard at St Andrew and St Cuthman's to provide a continuous wildlife corridor and sanctuary that we might all benefit from at the heart of Stevning'.

December Gardening Journal

December is the bleakest month in the gardening calendar. The last of the leaves are blown off the trees and the summer just gone is a distant memory. With so many other things to keep us occupied this time of the year, our gardens are often forgotten until after the new year too. Don't sit back for too long though as there is still work to do and its never a bad thing to tick off the odd job every now and then to ensure you are ready when spring arrives.

As the seasons turn, different plants take center stage in the garden, and while most people think of Hydrangeas in their prime being late summer I like to think they have value in the winter garden too. The seedheads create a dramatic effect as the sun shines through the garden lighting up the structural form of the cone shaped seed head.

Hydrangea Limelights cone shaped blooms fade elegantly as the seasons change. The blooms persist well into autumn, and as that season advances many of the blooms will take on multiple shades of pink, mingling beautifully with other blooms that still retain their green tints. As the flowers fade the seed heads continue to provide interest as the leaves fall giving the garden some well needed texture, form and structure at a time when everything seems to disappear.

Hydrangea paniculata "Limelight" was bred by a Dutch breeder whose name is little known, and marketed solely by the patent



holder, Spring Meadow Farms. It is a gem of a summer flowering shrub which is easy to look after and can endure the coldest winter. They do not require any staking, need little pruning and the flower heads can be cut and dried and will provide a beautiful display indoorsalmost indefinitely.

Hydrangea Limelight likes a good loamy soil, but it is adaptable as long as you water well in the first couple of years while it establishes and climatizes itself in your garden. Once established this particular hydrangea would benefit from a yearly prune, to be done at the end of the winter before the leaves start to sprout in spring. Pruning should be minimal and should be about creating a good framework, shape and height appropriate for its place in the garden. Its best to let the shrub develop its own natural form if at all possible.

If you are looking to create a combination for the winter months then I would suggest combining Hydrangea Limelight with

Ornamental Grasses like Miscanthus and Panicum can also work well as the grasses provide great textural contrasts during the summer months as well as winter interest too. Small evergreen shrubs like Pittosporum Tom Thumb and Sarcococca can also be included to ensure you have some solid structure to contrast with the softer textures of the Hydrangea seedheads and the grasses too.

In short if you are looking for a shrub that will light up your garden in both summer and winter then perhaps Hydrangea Limelight may just be the right shrub for you.

Jobs to do this month include: Ornamental Garden:

- Give the borders one last tidy before Christmas by removing any debris, leaves etc.
- Check newly planted shrubs for wind rock (loosened soil around base) after strong winds firming soil.

- Avoid any pruning when frost or snow is forecast.
- Replenish birdfeeders as soon as they run out.
- Plant winter flowering shrubs like daphne and sarcococca.
- Prune acer, betula before mid-December to avoid bleeding cuts.
- Mulch if the weather is still mild.

Vegetable Garden:

- Harvest winter vegetables like sprouts etc.
- Clear any remaining plant debris and compost.
- Prune free standing apples, pears, currants and gooseberries.
- Do not prune stone fruit until spring to avoid silver leaf disease.
- Prune grape vines by mid-December.
- Continue to plant fruit bushes etc.
- Divide and re plant rhubarb.
- Lag outdoor taps and pipes to avoid them freezing.
- Ventilate greenhouse on mild days.

In the Bleak Mid-Winter

The Christmas Season of 1902-1903 in Steyning was cold and ended with snow being driven in by a biting East wind. By January 14th Wiston Pond was so thoroughly frozen that young and old from Steyning, and many others, abandoned their regular pursuits and went skating. A Paperchase scheduled for the Thursday was cancelled; a Temperance meeting drew almost no audience and a West Sussex Senior League football match between Steyning and Chichester was called off. But the match between Steyning Hornets (a rag-bag of players) and the Brighton Telegraph Messengers continued despite the hard-frozen ground.

All this we know from copies of a weekly newspaper called 'The Steyning Observer' which flourished - very, very briefly - during December 1902 and January 1903. They no doubt enjoyed their football but were not impressed by the Steyning Hornets who they accused of 'kicking at random and never knowing in which direction the ball was likely to go': a little unkind, perhaps, given the frozen pitch. A few weeks earlier their reporter had complained that the senior team had 'not treated us to a scientific exposition of the game, for a more rough and tumble match it has seldom been my lot to witness'. He was not easily pleased; he grumbled that there was much too much 'strong language' used on the field - particularly as ladies were present. He also had a dig at the referee saying that 'Some of the decisions seemed to be rather quaint.'

However, the Steyning Observer was not only concerned with football and the bitter weather – so cold, we are told, that bedroom water-jugs developed thick layers

of ice overnight. It also shone a light onto other Steyning events. Christmas time, we find, was when local organisations marked the end of the year with celebratory dinners. The first of these was the 'Clem' dinner – so called because it was

held on 23rd November, the feast of St. Clement, St. Clement was the patron saint of blacksmiths and by a long tradition that was the only day of the year when they had a holiday. However, although blacksmiths were no doubt present, by 1902 it was an opportunity for a good dinner and some musical entertainment 'for upwards of sixty people'. On this occasion it was held at the Rising Sun in Beeding and was presided over by Felix Cherryman, a butcher. The entertainment was songs from the diners themselves, Mr Cherryman's contribution being 'I would not be an Emperor'. The Observer added that 'great fun was obtained from the old custom of 'choruses' which imposes a penalty on all present of singing a chorus or paying a fine of threepence'.

The 'Clem' dinner was not the only one Felix Cherryman went to. He, along with many others put money into one of Steyning's 'Slate Clubs' which were run by the pubs – and they, too, had their annual dinners. The George Inn (at the Mouse Lane corner)

> initiated the first Steyning Slate Club and by Christmas 1902 it had been running for eleven years. The Clubs existed so that working men could save for a rainy day. Their contributions were looked after by the pub so that, in the event

that a member of the Club fell ill and could not work, small sums of money were quickly available to help out – even if people needed to save with a larger Friendly Society such as the Oddfellows as well. In 1902 the George's Slate Club paid out £51 (some £8,000 in today's money) from an income of £58.

One other dinner referred to by the Observer conjures up an image of a rollicking smokefilled room. The 'Smoker' provided a dinner, plenty to drink, smoking and songs and recitations by the diners themselves.

Times and tastes have changed, of course. It is a little unlikely, I suppose, that today's readers of this piece will have come across songs as varied as 'Pansy Blossom', 'The Boers have got my Daddy' and 'The Gorgonzola Cheese'. Shame about the smoking.
